That the Southern Nevada District Board of Health *approves the Agreement between the Southern Nevada Health District and Computer Projection Systems LLC doing business as CCS Presentation Systems for performing a comprehensive upgrade of the Red Rock Conference Room AV system.*

DISCUSSION:

Southern Nevada Health District seeks to upgrade the AV technology in its main conference room (Red Rock). Red Rock is used for Board of Health meetings, department meetings, training events, and flex clinic space. The current technology deployed is beyond its life expectancy and increasingly unreliable.

FUNDING:

The Southern Nevada Health District issued a formal solicitation for these services. CCS Presentations were awarded based on budget, scope, and experience. The project total proposal from CCS Presentations is \$323,224.30. This project was budgeted for through capital funding in FY26.

THIS AGREEMENT FOR PURCHASE AND INSTALLATION OF AUDIO/VISUAL EQUIPMENT (“Agreement”) is by and between the Southern Nevada Health District (“Health District”) and Computer Projection Systems LLC doing business as CCS Presentation Systems (“Contractor”) (individually “Party” and collectively “Parties”).

RECITALS

WHEREAS, Health District is the public health entity organized pursuant to Nevada Revised Statutes (“NRS”), Chapter 439 with jurisdiction over all public health matters within Clark County, Nevada;

WHEREAS, Health District seeks to upgrade the Audio/Visual (“AV”) technology in its divisible Red Rock conference room located at 280 S. Decatur Blvd., Las Vegas, Nevada, 89107 (“Red Rock”);

WHEREAS, Contractor provides full-service integration, installation, and maintenance of AV equipment, to include large format LCD displays, digital projectors, interactive flat panel displays, room control systems, audio systems, and high-definition video conferencing systems; and Contractor offers its customers training on AV equipment installed;

WHEREAS, pursuant to Contractor’s Proposal, submitted on February 5, 2026 in response to Health District’s Request for Proposals 26RFP003 dated January 6, 2026 with an addendum dated January 22, 2026, Contractor represents its willingness to purchase AV equipment on Health District’s behalf, install it into Red Rock, and provide Health District end-users with equipment training (“Services”), and that it possesses the professional and technical expertise, and the personnel and resources necessary to provide the Services consistent with Health District’s requirements, and its personnel have sufficient expertise, knowledge, skill and experience to execute the Services.

NOW, THEREFORE in consideration of the mutual promises and agreements hereinafter set forth, the Parties agree as follows:

- 1) **TERM, TERMINATION AND AMENDMENT**. This Agreement shall be effective from the last signature affixed hereto through Contractor’s successful installation of AV equipment and provision of hands-off training for Health District’s end-user staff pursuant to the terms and conditions of this Agreement (“End Date”). Notwithstanding anything to the contrary,

the End Date of this Agreement shall not extend beyond June 30, 2026.

- 1.01 This Agreement may be terminated by either Party sooner, provided that a termination shall not be effective until thirty (30) days after a Party has served written notice upon the other Party.
 - 1.02 This Agreement may be terminated by mutual consent of both Parties or unilaterally by either Party with or without cause. Termination for cause will eliminate the thirty (30) day waiting period described above in Subsection 1.01.
 - 1.03 This Agreement will immediately terminate (i) if Contractor becomes excluded, debarred, suspended, or otherwise ineligible to participate in federal programs, including federal health care programs and federal procurement or non-procurement programs; or (ii) if Contractor's insurance as required pursuant to this Agreement is canceled or non-renewed; or (iii) if, upon Health District request, Contractor fails to timely produce evidence of current insurance coverage in accordance with this Agreement.
 - 1.04 Upon termination, Contractor will be entitled to payment for services provided prior to date of termination and for which Contractor has submitted an invoice but has not been paid.
 - 1.05 This Agreement is subject to the availability of funding and shall be terminated immediately if, for any reason, state and/or federal funding ability, or grant funding budgeted to satisfy this Agreement is withdrawn, limited or impaired.
 - 1.06 This Agreement may only be amended, modified or supplemented by a writing signed by a duly authorized agent/officer of each Party and effective as of the date stipulated therein.
- 2) INCORPORATED DOCUMENTS. The following attachments are expressly made a part of and incorporated by reference into this Agreement:
- ATTACHMENT A: SCOPE OF WORK
ATTACHMENT B: PAYMENT
- 3) COMPENSATION.
- 3.01 Contractor will perform the Services in a professional and timely manner consistent with the Scope of Work outlined in Attachment A and will be eligible for compensation as detailed in Attachment B, Payment. The Total Not-to-Exceed Amount of this Agreement is \$323,224.30.
- 4) CONTRACTOR ASSURANCES.
- 4.01 Contractor acknowledges to the best of its knowledge, information, and belief, and to the extent required by law, neither Contractor nor any of its employees/contractors is/are: i) currently excluded, debarred, suspended, or otherwise ineligible to participate in federal health care programs or in federal procurement or non-procurement programs; and ii) has/have not been convicted of

a federal or state offense that falls within the ambit of 42 USC 1320a-7(a).

5) STATUS OF PARTIES; INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR.

5.01 Contractor will provide Services in accordance with this Agreement as an independent contractor to the Health District. Nothing contained in this Agreement will be construed to create a joint venture or partnership, or the relationship of principal and agent or employer and employee, between Contractor and Health District. Nothing in this Agreement or the relationship between Health District and Contractor shall create a co-employment or joint employer relationship.

6) MUTUAL COOPERATION. The Parties shall fully cooperate with one another in furtherance of this Agreement, and shall provide assistance to one another in the investigation and resolution of any complaints, claims, actions or proceedings that may arise out of the provision of Services hereunder.

6.01 The Parties shall take any additional acts or sign any additional documents as is reasonably necessary, appropriate, or convenient to achieve the purposes of this Agreement.

7) SUBCONTRACTING. Contractor shall not subcontract any portion of the Services required by this Agreement.

8) CONFIDENTIALITY. No protected health information as that term is defined in the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996, or personally identifiable information will be shared with Contractor during the course of this Agreement. Consistent with state and federal privacy laws, Contractor will at all times have in place procedures to ensure the privacy and maintain the confidentiality of any information received with at least the same degree of care as it maintains the confidentiality of its own confidential information of like import. Accordingly, no Business Associate Agreement is required.

9) NOTICES. All notices permitted or required under this Agreement shall be made via overnight courier, or U.S. certified mail with return receipt requested to the other Party at its address as set forth below:

10) KEY PERSONNEL. The Health District's Facilities Manager shall be the overall manager of this Agreement, will assign all tasks and due dates for all work, and be the single point-of-contact for resolution of Agreement related issues. Carl Cook, Account Manager, shall be the single point of contact for Contractor.

11) INSURANCE. Contractor at its sole cost and expense agrees to obtain and maintain in full force and effect during the term of this Agreement, insurance in commercially reasonable amounts calculated to protect itself and the Health District from any and all claims of any

kind or nature for damage to property or personal injury, including death, made by anyone, that may arise from activities performed or facilitated by this Agreement, whether these activities are performed by Contractor or anyone directly or indirectly engaged or employed by Contractor. Contractor will provide evidence of its NRS-compliant workers' compensation insurance to Health District at riskmanagement@snhd.org before commencing the Services. Upon Health District's request, Contractor will provide evidence of other insurance coverages pursuant to this Section 11 within five (5) business days.

12) CERTIFICATION, RESTRICTION OF BOYCOTT OF ISRAEL. Pursuant to NRS 332.065, Contractor certifies that it is not currently engaged in, and agrees for the duration of the Agreement not to engage in, a boycott of Israel.

13) STANDARD WARRANTY.

13.01 Contractor warrants the workmanship, material, and equipment supplied for the AV installation be free from defects for a period of one (1) year from the date of completion. Warranty for such defects, including full replacements if necessary, will be handled by Contractor in a reasonable and timely manner.

13.02 After Contractor's one (1) year warranty ends, Health District will be charged for any service calls to troubleshoot or repair the AV system installed by Contractor including the facilitation of a manufacturer's warranty. Health District and Contractor may elect to enter into an extended maintenance agreement for preventative and warranty repairs at an additional charge.

13.03 Manufacturer's warranties are of varying lengths (usually from 90 days up to three (3) years). Contractor will warranty this equipment for the term established by the manufacturer on a depot basis only.

13.04 Contractor must provide Health District with copies of each and every manufacturer's warranty relating to the AV installation before final payment to Contractor can be assessed.

13.05 Contractor's warranty will not apply to any product that has been subjected by Health District to misuse, neglect, accident, or operational error.

13.06 Notwithstanding the Warranty, Health District does not waive its rights to pursue available remedies under applicable law.

14) GENERAL PROVISIONS.

14.01 BREACH; REMEDIES. Failure of either Party to perform any obligation of this Agreement shall be deemed a breach. Except as otherwise provided for by law or this Agreement, the rights and remedies of the Parties shall not be exclusive and are in addition to any other rights and remedies provided by law or equity, including but not limited to actual damages, and to a prevailing Party, the ability to seek reasonable attorneys' fees and costs.

14.02 WAIVER OF BREACH. Failure to declare a breach or the actual waiver of any particular breach of the Agreement or its material or non-material terms by either

Party shall not operate as a waiver by such Party of any of its rights or remedies as to any other breach.

- 14.03 LIMITED LIABILITY. Health District will not waive and intends to assert available NRS Chapter 41 liability limitations in all cases. To the extent applicable, actual agreement damages for any breach shall be limited by NRS 353.260 and NRS 354.626. Agreement liability of both Parties shall not be subject to punitive damages.
- 14.04 NON-DISCRIMINATION. Contractor employs employees without regard to race, sex, color, religion, age, ancestry, national origin, marital status, status as a disabled veteran, or veteran of the Vietnam era, disability, sexual orientation or gender identity or expression. Contractor agrees that it will comply with all state and federal employment discrimination statutes, including but not limited to Title VII and the American with Disabilities Act.
- 14.05 FORCE MAJEURE. Neither Party shall be deemed to be in violation of this Agreement if it is prevented from performing any of its obligations hereunder due to strikes, failure of public transportation, civil or military authority, act of public enemy, acts of terrorism, accidents, fires, explosions, or acts of God, including, without limitation, earthquakes, floods, winds, or storms. In such an event the intervening cause must not be through the fault of the Party asserting such an excuse, and the excused Party is obligated to promptly perform in accordance with the terms of the Agreement after the intervening cause ceases.
- 14.06 COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS. Contractor shall keep itself informed of and in compliance with all federal, state and local laws, ordinances, regulations, appropriations restrictions, and orders that may affect in any manner the provision of goods and/or performance of services, or those engaged to perform services under this Agreement.
- 14.07 SEVERABILITY. If any provision contained in this Agreement is held to be unenforceable by a court of law or equity, this Agreement shall be construed as if such provision did not exist and the non-enforceability of such provision shall not be held to render any other provision or provisions of this Agreement unenforceable.
- 14.08 USE OF NAME AND LOGO. Contractor may not use the Health District's name or logo for any purpose without the Health District's prior written consent. Health District retains the right to impose restrictions on the use of its name and/or logo and terminate, with or without cause, Contractor's right to use the Health District's name and/or logo.
- 14.09 PROPER AUTHORITY. The Parties hereto represent and warrant that the person executing this Agreement on behalf of each Party has full power and authority to enter into this Agreement and that the Parties are authorized by law to perform the services set forth in the documents incorporated herein.

- 14.10 INTEGRATION CLAUSE. This Agreement, including all Attachments hereto, as it may be amended from time to time, contains the entire agreement among the Parties relative to the subject matter hereof.
- 14.11 EXCLUSIVITY. This Agreement is non-exclusive and both Parties remain free to enter into similar agreements with third parties. Contractor may perform services for any other clients, persons, or companies as Contractor sees fit, so long as the performance of such services does not interfere with Contractor's performance of obligations under this Agreement, and does not, in the opinion of Health District, create a conflict of interest.
- 14.12 INDEMNIFICATION. Parties do not waive any right or defense to indemnification that may exist in law or equity.
- 14.13 PUBLIC RECORDS. Pursuant to NRS Chapter 239, information or documents, including this Agreement and any other documents generated incidental thereto may be opened to public inspection and copying unless a particular record is made confidential by law or a common law balancing of interests.
- 14.14 ASSIGNMENT. The Parties shall not assign, transfer, or delegate any rights, obligations or duties under this Agreement without the other Party's prior written consent.
- 14.15 NO THIRD-PARTY BENEFICIARIES. This Agreement is for the sole benefit of the Parties hereto and their respective successors and permitted assigns and nothing herein, express or implied, is intended to or shall confer upon any other person or entity any legal or equitable right, benefit, or remedy of any nature whatsoever under or by reason of this Agreement.
- 14.16 TIME. Contractor agrees that time is of the essence to this Agreement.
- 14.17 COUNTERPARTS. This Agreement may be executed in counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, but which together shall constitute one instrument. A signed copy delivered by facsimile, email or other means of electronic transmissions shall have the same force and effect as an original signed copy.

IN WITNESS THEREOF, the Parties hereto have caused this Agreement to be executed by their undersigned officials as duly authorized.

ATTACHMENT A SCOPE OF WORK

- A. In support of upgrading the AV technology in Red Rock, Contractor will:
- A.1 Review current room layouts and needed services to propose the best overall solution to meet Health District's requirements for high reliability and ease of use.
 - A.2 Assess current room layouts and infrastructure and design a complete system including equipment specifications, wiring diagrams, and user interface mock-ups.
 - A.3 Provide all necessary audio, video, control, and connectivity hardware with emphasis on highly reliable, industry-standard solutions known for their quality, durability, and interoperability.
 - A.4 Uninstall/remove old equipment. Health District will recycle/repurpose old equipment.
 - A.5 Install new equipment, cabling, and mounting hardware, ensuring minimal disruption to Health District's daily operations Monday- Thursday 7:00 AM - 6:00 PM. After-hours access may be available.
 - A.6 Program and configure system to ensure optimal performance, ease of use, and compatibility with Health District's existing IT infrastructure.
 - A.7 Test all components and functionalities to verify system performance and reliability.
 - A.8 Provide complete system documentation, including user manuals and manufacturer warranties, administrator guides, and as-built drawings.
 - A.9 Provide one full day (eight hours) of onsite training. Onsite training will occur after Health District has received complete documentation of system installation and functionality. Contractor will provide two (2) additional two (2) hour virtual trainings free of charge as requested by Health District.
- B. Contractor will provide and install the following into Red Rock:
- B.1 (3) Ceiling mounted projectors and drop grid mounts. Projectors offer 30,000 hours of operation with 3LCD Laser technology. Brightness is 7300 Lumens with resolution of WUXGA.
 - B.2 (3) Projector Screens 16x9 aspect (16:10 recommended for computer image aspect). Da-Lite Da-snap pro trim 78"x139" with diagonal of 159" HD progressive 1.0 fabric - 39111V. Throw distance 15'7" thru 25'5". The HD progressive 1.0 fabric is recommended for large room front projection laser projectors.

- B.3 (2) Crestron wireless touch panels one for each division with tabletop charging station.
- B.4 (1) Wireless access points ethernet for both room divisions.
- B.5 (8) QSC NC-12x80 PTZ network cameras. Wall mount is included with camera. Ceiling mounts have been supplied. Two new locations are TBD; other six locations are existing. We are removing existing OFE PTZ cameras. Camera control via IP.
- B.6 (8) Crestron wall plate encoders located at each camera location. PTZ cameras will be available video sources in addition to being available for Teams/Zoom UC calls.
- B.7 (2) Access point audio transceivers in each of the room divisions. Required to provide divide and combine capability.
- B.8 (30) Wireless conferencing units with voting capability, display, and speakers. Microphone sold separately.
- B.9 (30) 16" Goose neck microphone with cardioid pick up pattern.
- B.10 (3) 10 station network charging stations to accommodate 30 batteries from conferencing units.
- B.11 (30) Wired desktop back up microphones. Infrastructure in place to pull/reuse wiring back to control room AV rack.
- B.12 (6) Flush mounted ceiling speakers
- B.13 (1) Assistive listening system that meets ADA requirements for a room this size with occupancy 144. (5) assistive receivers and earpieces will be available.
- C. Contract will provide and install the following into Red Rock's control room on owner-furnished equipment racks:
 - C.1 (1) 24 RU floor standing rack and accessories. Will be used to build rack in CCS shop to save time and money.
 - C.2 (1) Crestron Control processor with Subnet
 - C.3 (2) Crestron DM chassis to house DM-NVX encoder/decoder cards. Eight card capacity.
 - C.4 (8) Crestron DM-NVX encoders and decoder cards populated in the DM card chassis. (2) encoders/inputs for each of the room PCs per division, (2) for Crestron encoders/inputs for each of the Crestron UC engines per division, (1) decoder for SMP recorder/stream, (1) encoder reserved for control room input, and (2) encoders to provide content ingest into the Crestron UC systems.

- C.5 (10) Crestron AV over IP encoder/decoders. (6) decoders three projectors and OFE 86" displays. (4) Encoders in the large divisible meeting room, (2) in each division.
- C.6 (2) 48 ports POE+ network switch. Switches will reside in the control room and will not be connected to the SNHD LAN.
- C.7 (2) Owner furnished room PCs with HDMI/DP output, one for each for the two divisions.
- C.8 (2) Crestron Flex UC bundles UC-CXIOO-T into the owner furnished rack space.
- C.9 (1) Digital Sound Processor with 64 channels of AEC and 64x64 Dante license.
- C.10 (1) 4-channel audio amplifier with Dante
- C.11 (4) QSC USB 10 Bridges. (1) for each of the two Crestron UC's room (1) for each of the two room PC's (make calls without PC request in addendum 1 Q&A).
- C.12 (9) QSC QIO-ML4i peripheral with 4 mic/line for 36 audio input channels for 30 wired microphones and other rack audio sources.
- C.13 (4) QSC QIO-GP8X8 peripheral with 8x8 logic inputs and outputs providing 32 logic IO's for the 30 wired microphones.
- C.14 (1) QSC QIO-L4 peripheral with 4 audio output require for rack audio outputs (Assistive listening and others).
- C.15 (1) SMP 251H.264 streaming media processor. AV recording and streaming. Separate from the Teams/Zoom recordings.

D. Exclusions. Contractor will not engage in work involving the following:

- D.1 High voltage electrical wiring and receptacles
- D.2 Low voltage conduit (Contractor will use plenum cable above ceiling grid)
- D.3 Installation and integration of any equipment not included in this Agreement.

E. Contractor acknowledges and accepts the following conditions:

- E.1 As is practicable, this is an after hours and weekend installation. Red Rock is generally not open for installation Monday- Thursday 7:00 AM -6:00 PM. After-hours access may be available.
- E.2 There is a 2x2 Drop grid ceiling with hard deck in center for room division wall.
- E.3 Health District will be installing qty (3) new 8611 displays to replace the qty (3) old

display currently in place.

- E.4 Site survey information – Health District requested an iPad or dedicated wireless touch panel for control interface.
- E.5 Health District requested via Q&A to have the ability to make UC calls with and without using the room PC. Creston UC Flex added to accommodate.
- E.6 Tariff Surcharges are already included in the pricing of this Agreement per manufacturer.

B. Training, pursuant to Attachment A, Scope of Work, will be delivered by Contractor at no additional charge to Health District.

C. Invoices submitted to Health District by Contractor shall specify the Southern Nevada Health District as the party responsible for payment.

- C.1 Invoices shall contain, at a minimum, Contractor's name, contract number, date and hours worked, description of work completed, and total amount invoiced. Hours worked will be documented through Contractor's provision of progress pictures of the MHV build.
- C.2 Contractor invoices shall be signed by the Contractor or the Contractor's official representative and shall include a statement certifying that the invoice is a true and accurate billing.
- C.3 Contractor invoices shall reference Agreement number C2600106, and shall be submitted to Health District's Facilities Manager and ap@snhd.org for approval and payment

D. Health District shall not be liable for interest charges on late payments.

E. In the event items on an invoice are disputed, payment on those items will be held until the dispute is resolved. Undisputed items will not be held with disputed items.
