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**RE: PUBLIC HEALTH & PREVENTIVE CARE BOARD OF HEALTH REPORT – June 2026**

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The Public Health and Preventive Care (PPC) Division is dedicated to protecting and promoting the health of our community. Through a range of clinical services, programmatic initiatives, and community outreach efforts, PPC works to prevent disease, support wellness, and ensure access to essential resources for all residents. Our goal is to create a healthier, more equitable community by addressing public health needs with care, collaboration, and evidence-based practices.

## I. Immunization Program

### A. Immunization Program Activities

1. The Immunization Clinic is in the process of implementing the Workplace/Community Vaccination and Screening Program, with services beginning on July 7, 2026. This new program will provide low-cost occupational and community screening services, including QuantiFERON-TB Gold (QFT) and Tuberculin Skin Testing (TST), to support employers, employees, and community members in meeting tuberculosis screening requirements.
2. During the reporting period, a total of 1,687 clients were seen across the Southern Nevada Health District's four public health centers. In total, 3,441 vaccines were administered to individuals in the Southern Nevada community.
3. The four public health centers (PHC) continue to accommodate same-day appointments. A total of 320 same-day appointments were provided across the PHCs during this reporting period.
4. Influenza and COVID-19 vaccine administration continued to trend downward during the reporting period, consistent with national vaccination trends observed following the peak respiratory virus season. Despite lower demand, the Health District continues to maintain vaccine availability and provide education regarding the benefits of vaccination, particularly for populations at increased risk for severe illness. Updated clinical guidance for the 2025–2026 COVID-19 vaccine season remains available to assist healthcare providers and community members in making informed vaccination decisions.

### B. Immunization Outreach Activities

1. Immunization outreach clinics in June 2026 - 11 clinics, 254 vaccines were administered to 129 clients. The clinics were held at CCSD Family Support Center, CCSD schools, Mexican Consulate and at Harm Reduction.

## **II. Community Health Nursing**

### **A. Nursing Education**

Four (4) nurses were awarded with one (1) CEU, and fourteen (14) attendance certificates were given out for one course in the month of June.

### **B. Maternal Child Health**

The Maternal Child Health (MCH) Nurse for Lead and Newborn screen received no referrals for the month of June. There are currently five (5) active clients enrolled in the Lead program. The MCH nurse continues to help the Healthy Start program by completing nurse home visits.

### **C. Nurse Family Partnership (NFP)**

The Southern Nevada Health District Nurse-Family Partnership (NFP) has 128 active families. Sixty-four (64) are participating in the Maternal Infant and early Childhood Home Visiting (MIECHV) Program. Thirteen (13) are participating through the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) funding. Grants are from the Nevada Division of Public and Behavioral Health. Three (3) nurses have increased their outreach efforts. They are collaborating with different OB providers, WIC, and other service providers to increase SNHD NFP presence in the community.

### **D. Healthy Start Initiative- Enhanced**

The Southern Nevada Health District's Healthy Start (HS) Initiative Program is supported by the Health Resources and Service Administration (HRSA) of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS). There were 84 families served in June 2026. In-person program outreach was conducted at Desert Breeze Community Center, Sahara West Library, Spring Valley Library, Pearson Community Center, East Las Vegas Library, Nevada Healthy Centers WIC (Bonanza location), The Center, J.D. Smith Middle School, East Las Vegas Community Center, The Children's Cabinet, Nevada Health Centers WIC (MLK location), the 4<sup>th</sup> Annual Readers In Training Resource Fair, Baby's Bounty, Family Promise, Catholic Charities, Allyfe, Help of Southern Nevada, Signs of Hope, Serenity Birth Center, The Boys and Girls Club, Jeremiah Program, Hollywood Recreation Center, and Bob E. Price Recreation Center. Program outreach was also conducted at various DWSS locations. Our Community Health Worker II (CHW) continues to create community partnerships to grow our program and our consortium. She has also scheduled health literacy and cultural competency workshops to fulfill deliverables for our Community Consortium Action Plan.

### **E. Embracing Fatherhood**

Embracing Fatherhood (EF) home visiting program continues to support father's and father figures with children 0-3 in the greater Las Vegas area. Home visits include education, community resources, screenings, and support. In the month of June, the program received five (5) referrals with two (2) pending July enrollments. Currently, there are 8 active families enrolled in Embracing Fatherhood. In-person program outreach was conducted at Centennial library/Rec Center, Cimarron Rose Rec Center, Mirabell Community Center, Durango Hills Community Center, Mountain Crest Community Center, and Serenity Birthing Center. Embracing Fatherhood hosted the Dad's Skill's and Drill's event on 06/25/2026, in collaboration with Health Plan of Nevada/Medicaid, Whitney Recreation Center, LVMPD, Dads Inc, Healthy Start, and Discovery Children's Museum.

## **III. Sexual Health Outreach and Prevention Program (SHOPP)**

- A. Express Testing (ET) is a program that conducts testing for sexually transmitted infections (STI's) for asymptomatic patients, without requiring a provider exam. ET completed 241 screening encounters for the month of May. Patients who test positive for STI results are guided to appropriate treatment, primarily to SNHD's Health Center or referred according to patient preference.

- B. The **Congenital Syphilis Case Management Program (CSCMP)** is a program to address the high rate of congenital syphilis in the community. The CSCMP nurses, in coordination with perinatal Hep B and HIV programs, continue to meet monthly to plan future targeted education sessions to increase knowledge and awareness of these diseases and available resources. The team is currently serving 44 active clients and provided 2 community trainings.
- C. SHOPP houses the **Complex STI Navigation services (C-STIN)** including the **Neurosyphilis Emergent Onsite Navigation (NEON)** program, which provides critical linkage services to patients suspected of neurosyphilis, and **Home Administered Treatment for STI's (HATS)**, which delivers STI treatment in the field for patients who are unable to access clinic-based care. There were 3 clients navigated for neurosyphilis in June.
- D. The SHOPP **Rapid PREVENT** program enrolled a total of 48 clients as part of HRSA demonstration grant whose enrolling period ended on 5/31/26. Although this program has completed the enrollment portion for the HRSA demonstration grant, the whole-person approach continues to be the foundation of the program as the team continues assess for and provide resources and linkages for client identified needs. In June, another 6 clients received CHW non-medical case management services with the goal of HIV prevention. CHW's for this initiative work collaboratively with Express Testing to assess and provide linkage to care services and community resources.
- E. SHOPP's **Pathways to Better Health (PBH)** program serves pregnant/postpartum mothers and follows until the infant turns one year of age. The Community Health Workers support, educate and provide linkages and referrals with the goal of improving health outcomes during and after pregnancy for both moms and babies. This program has 35 active clients.

#### IV. Street Medicine (SM) – Introduction of New Program

- A. Program Launch & Staffing  
The Street and Medicine program continues to deliver essential primary care services directly to unhoused individuals- meeting them where they are, in line with the recognized philosophy of street medicine: going to the people and centering their needs. The APRN and Senior Community Health Nurse conduct primary care visits with the added support of two CHWs who focus on engagement and linkage to identified community resources, including housing, insurance, and psychosocial services.
- B. Community Engagement & Collaboration  
The Street Medicine team in collaboration with **Help of Southern Nevada, City of Henderson/Salvation Army, Whitney Library/Clean the World Showers, and Goodness Gracious Outreach at Sunset Park** provided primary care to clients at multiple outreach events for the unhoused and members of our team assisted in screenings at the **Courtyard**.
- C. Approach & Intent  
This primary care initiative embraces a harm-reduction and trauma-informed care model—focused on building trust through consistent outreach, nonjudgmental engagement, and accountability in meeting patients where they are. Community partnerships will play an instrumental role in both piloting and scaling the program effectively. This month the Street Medicine Team met with **Veterans Affairs** to better understand how they provide resources to Veterans who are unhoused. Furthermore, the Street Medicine Team presented the program to **Anthem** leadership to collaborate on ways our teams can meet the needs of clients experiencing homelessness who have Anthem insurance.
- D. Street Medicine completed **36** primary care visits in **June**.

## **V. Tuberculosis (TB) Clinic**

TB clinic has one (1) new adult TB active cases and zero (0) pediatric cases for the month of June 2026.

## **VI. Employee Health Nursing – June 2026**

- A. Employee New Hire and Annual Tuberculosis (TB) testing continues, and annual catchup TB testing is ongoing. Forty-four (44) Tuberculosis tests were completed.
- B. Employee New Hire and Annual FIT Testing Medical Evaluations continue. Twenty-eight (28) medical clearances were completed.
- C. Vaccine Administration

- D. New Hire/Onboarding: Two (2) new hires were onboarded.
