A. Enforcement Actions and Investigations

North Las Vegas Office

- November 4, Grand China Restaurant, 4444 W Craig: Staff closed the facility for no hot water available at the kitchen hand sinks. The facility re-opened with an "A" grade on November 5.
- November 9, Purple Sage Motel, 1920 E Fremont: Staff closed three rooms for mattresses in disrepair and stained. The facility passed inspection on November 10 with new mattresses.
- November 9, Sky Ranch Motel, 2009 E Fremont: Staff closed two rooms for mattresses in disrepair and stained. Payment for the closure fee and re-inspection are still pending.
- November 18, Taste of Paradise Island Grill, 445 W Craig: Staff closed the facility for operating without hot water. After not receiving a re-inspection request, staff surveyed the facility on November 29 and found it operating under the closure order and the hot water heater still in disrepair. The facility was ordered to Cease and Desist all food activities. The facility re-opened with an "A" grade on November 30.

Henderson Office

- November 8, Schofield Middle School, 8625 Spencer: Staff observed pizza being sold from the student store without a health permit. The sale of pizza was Ceased and Desisted and the operator was directed to contact SNHD Plan review to obtain a health permit. A health permit was issued November 24.
- November 10, Buffalo Wild Wings, 7430 S Las Vegas Blvd: Staff investigated two Nevada Clean Indoor Air Act (NCIAA) complaints on the bar. Neither could be substantiated at that time. Staff educated the facility operator on the requirements of NCIAA. On November 15, staff investigated additional NCIAA complaints and staff found the complaint on the bar was substantiated since patrons were smoking in the facility and facility employees were not requesting that patrons cease smoking.
- November 12, Budget Suites, 8440 S Las Vegas Blvd: Staff surveyed the facility compliance with a previous inspection and found that the facility was not providing linens to its guests as required by SNHD Public Accommodations Regulations. The facility's claim is that extended-stay guests fall under landlord tenant law not SNHD regulation. The matter is currently being discussed between the legal counsels of the facility and SNHD.
- November 16, Buffalo Wild Wings, 617 Mall Ring: Staff investigated a Nevada Clean Indoor Air Act (NCIAA) complaint alleging patrons were smoking at the bar. Staff found that the complaint was valid. One patron was observed by staff to be smoking at the bar. The bartender directed patron to stop smoking and the patron complied. Staff educated facility management that compliance with NCIAA is required. The facility manager sent an e-mail to staff that identified a designated area outside for patrons to smoke.
- November 23, Serenity Helicopters, 1411 Airport #104: Staff investigated a complaint alleging food preparation without adequate permits. The investigation revealed that the facility had been preparing and storing snack boxes for their Grand Canyon tours without a health permit and was issued a Cease and Desist for their food operations. Staff also instructed the facility operators to contact Plan Review to obtain a health permit. The facility has contacted Plan Review and is in the process of obtaining a health permit.

East Las Vegas Office

- November 3, Nellis Suites, 4555 N Las Vegas Blvd: Staff closed five rooms for UV positive stained mattresses and box springs. The rooms were re-opened on November 23.
- November 4, Siegel Suites Craig, 5230 E Craig: Staff inspected the facility and three rooms were posted closed and three rooms posted "do not re-rent".
- November 5, Holiday Inn Express, 4035 N Nellis: Staff found the pool to be re-opened without a re-inspection after being closed for violations earlier this year. The pool was re-closed.
- November 16, Extended Stay, 1550 E Flamingo: Four rooms were closed due to stained mattresses.
- November 17, Carniceria La Mexicana Meat Market, 1110 E Charleston: The facility was closed for failing initial inspection with 52 demerits. Violations included adulterated foods, improper cooling and food handling. The facility re-opened on November 19.
- November 23, East Cannery Hotel and Casino: Five rooms were closed due to stained mattresses.

Strip Office

- November 2, Aruba Hotel, 1215 S Las Vegas Blvd: Staff closed 14 rooms for stained or torn mattresses/box springs. The rooms remain closed.

- November 2, Fresh Smoothies Cart #2, Las Vegas Convention Center: Staff re-inspected and re-opened the cart which had been closed since September 22 due to no hot water.
- November 3, Desert Star Motel, 1210 S Las Vegas Blvd: Staff closed five rooms due to damaged mattresses or box springs. The rooms have been re-opened.
- November 12, Strip Supervisor and staff surveyed Cheetah's Strip Club to determine if they were still operating an unpermitted employee dining room (EDR). The survey disclosed the facility no longer offered food prepared at home for sale to employees. Two vending machines from Sky Pointe vending have been installed for employee use.
- November 15, Sky Pointe vending was directed to contact Plan Review and apply for permits for vending machines that contained Potentially Hazardous Foods (PHFs).
- November 17, Carniceria La Mexicana Restaurant, 1110 E Charleston: Staff closed the establishment with 52 demerits. Violations included improper cooling, food out of temperature, food storage violations, expired and moldy food, improper washing and sanitizing of food utensils, and improper food labeling. Due to previous issues at this restaurant a joint inspection was performed with the East office for Spanish interpretation and support during the inspection. The facility re-opened on November 19.

Special Programs

- November 9, Clearwire, 3525 E Post: Staff followed up on a complaint that food was being served in the lobby of the call center, and dust was blowing into the food. On a prior visit, the Clearwire facility manager stated that food is served in an adjacent office building by "The Kitchen" which is advertised as a "division of Soirees Catering and Events." Soirees Catering has valid food establishment and catering permits. The manager stated that employees of Clearwire pay at the point of sale of the lunch and they do not order food for their employees nor have a contract with the catering facility to provide food. Staff notified Clearwire that food service must Cease and Desist, and explained the options for providing food service to employees.
- November 19, Smith's Deli, 4600 E Sunset: Staff investigated a complaint of dirty conditions and comingled deli meats. The complaint was unsubstantiated however, the inspection, a sewer backup from a floor drain was observed. The deli manager stated that the drain had been in disrepair for two days. The deli was closed for repair of the drain and cleaning and sanitizing of the entire area. The deli was re-opened November 19.

B. Supervisory Conferences

Spring Valley Office:

- November 3, Kosher on the Go, 3250 W Ali Baba: A supervisory conference was held with the owners to discuss outstanding construction and compliance issues for the remodel of the processing permit. The owner was provided with an itemized list of issues to be corrected and a mutually agreeable compliance date was established.

Henderson Office:

- October 14, Ping Pong Thai Restaurant, 2955 E Sunset: Staff held a supervisory conference since the facility has failed to pass any of the three unannounced inspections conducted during 2010. At the conference, the history of repeat critical violations and the SNHD policy for investigating complaints was reviewed with the owner since each inspection during 2010 was accompanied with a complaint investigation. Also discussed were long term corrective actions that needed to be taken so that repeat critical violations do not occur during future inspections. These actions included facility managers demonstrate active managerial control of facility and follow the SNHD regulatory requirements for a Person in Charge, staff must be trained and held

accountable for their actions, and facility management must assure staff is properly trained and performing the work correctly. The facility will be on an increased inspection frequency until the facility operator has shown to have ongoing active managerial control so that during a routine inspection less than ten demerit points are observed. The facility passed re-inspection on October 18.

East Las Vegas Office:

- November 17, a meeting was held with the following downtown properties to discuss issues with outdoor bar regulation issues: Binion's Horseshoe, Four Queens, Fremont Hotel, and the Golden Gate Hotel. Plan Review supervisor also in attendance.
- November 30, a meeting was held with Fitzgerald Hotel & Casino Executive Management to review outside bar parameters and new regulations. Plan Review staff also attended.

C. Outreach/Partnerships

East Las Vegas Office:

- Throughout the course of the month, EHS staff member assisted and participated in Solid Waste Illegal Recycling investigations as needed by providing Spanish interpretation and translation.

Strip Office:

- November 9, staff participated in a Treasure Island Hotel and Casino manager's training meeting to provide the operator a better understanding of new regulatory guidance that became effective the first of the month and discuss specific impacts to their food operations.
- November 9, staff met with new executive chef of Monte Carlo Hotel and Casino regarding the new food regulations.
- November 16, staff attended a meeting at Caesar's Palace to meet with the newly hired, in-house sanitarian.
- November 17, Pamplémousse, 400 E Sahara: Staff met with F & B staff regarding contingency plans for dish machine disrepair due to the lack of a three compartment sink for back-up manual ware washing. The facility is older and was approved with only a two compartment sink.
- November 17, staff met with representatives from Hilton Grand Vacation Food and Beverage department and the sales department to provide guidance on permitting the two food areas located in the sales department.

Special Programs Office:

- November 19, staff attended a public forum regarding mobile unit ordinance revisions adopted by the City of Las Vegas. Staff shared with industry and city officials SNHD regulations and policies for ice cream trucks.

D. Multi-Agency Activities

East Las Vegas Office:

- November 4, staff assisted Special Programs and Metro with illegal vending operation.
- November 4, staff attended CMART meeting at Clark County Government Center (CCGC)

E. Special Events/Activities

Henderson Office:

- During the month of November, the Henderson/Laughlin EH offices conducted inspections at 25 Special Events with a total of 34 booth/venue inspections performed.

North Las Vegas Office:

- During November, NLV Office received the scheduling of 41 itinerant applications. Events included: The Great Craft Festival, the Turkey Shoot Soccer Tournament, and El Dia De Los Muertos. No major problems with public health concerns were noted.

Spring Valley Office:

- Special events and temporary events inspected by Spring Valley staff included: Indian National Finals Rodeo, Las Vegas Women's Expo, 2010 LV Turkey Shoot, LV Lacrosse Showcase 2010, Stu Miller Christmas Tree, Toys for Tots, Marie Callender's Feast Tent, Samoan Affairs of NV Picnic, Palms Special Event, Circo Hermanos Esqueda, Circus Vargas and Golf Fest for a total of 22 Temporary Food Establishments and six Special Events.

Strip Office:

- Special events and temporary events inspected by staff included: The All Star Weekend at Aria and Vdara Hotels, the SEMA 2010 convention, Diving Equipment and Marketing Association (DEMA) 2010 convention, Webmasters Show, and the Global Gaming Expo at the LVCC, Planet Hollywood Theatre, First Friday at Charleston and Main, Marie Callender's, the AAPEX Show at Sands Expo & Convention Center, Republican Party Election Night at Venetian Resort Hotel & Casino, and the Cigar Convention 2010 at the ballrooms of the Venetian and Palazzo Resort Hotel & Casinos. Staff inspected and approved 63 food and beverage booths and 94 sampling booths.

East Las Vegas Office:

- During the month of November staff inspected a total of 49 temporary food facilities. Events included: 14 booths at the Life in Death Festival, seven booths at the LVMS Sprint Car Event, seven booths at the LVMS Duel in the Desert.

F. Childhood Lead Poisoning Prevention Program

CLPPP Activities:

- November 3, staff participated in a joint meeting between SNHD administration and UNLV representatives to outline budgetary requirements and contributions necessary for the Nevada Healthy Homes Partnership program to be launched.
- November 3, staff met with IT staff to further develop integration of the Childhood Lead Poisoning Prevention Program's blood lead reports into the TriSano system.
- November 10, staff participated in a CDC conference call with CDC CLPPP/Healthy Homes Project Officer Larry Franklin to provide programmatic updates.
- November 18, staff met with representatives from the University of Nevada Las Vegas to develop Healthy Homes grant direction and further define program activities.

CLPPP Sub-Committee Meetings:

- November 4, staff hosted the CLPPP Project Staff meeting, which served to update program participants on current initiatives and outreach efforts.

G. Special Programs
Illegal Vending

- During November staff issued eight Cease and Desist notices to various street food vendors, and one Cease and Desist notice to an individual selling food from their residence. Below are some of the highlights from November.
- November 4, eight EHS's collaborated with LVMPD to address complaints regarding illegal fruit vending in the Southeast Area Command. No vendors were located during this action. During the next two weeks, three vendors were issued citations and their fruit was seized by LVMPD and SNHD. Further investigation is currently underway to locate the organizers of the illegal fruit vending.
- November 9, staff assisted Clark County Code Enforcement and Animal Control with a complaint of a residential property slaughtering animals for local food establishments and private sale. The property was given a written order for the removal of the slaughtering facility and structures housing the animals within 30 days. The owner of the animals, reportedly working from Reno, could not be located for a Cease and Desist order.
- November 12, staff collaborated with Clark County Business License regarding an illegal mobile vendor selling food to establishments near Wigwam Pkwy and S. Eastern under the name Holy Smoke BBQ. The vendor was issued a Cease and Desist order and a notice of violation. Any repeat occurrence of unpermitted and unlicensed sales from this vendor should result in a citation from Clark County Business License.
- November 19, Taqueria El Pastorcito Taco Trailer, 1655 E Charleston Blvd: Staff cited the facility for operating with unapproved equipment, insufficient health cards and an incorrect operational address. Upon paying closure fees and obtaining adequate health cards, a new permit was applied for at the correct address.

Child Care

- November 10, Harrah's Casino, Marine Corps Ball temporary childcare facility: Staff conducted an inspection of the temporary childcare facility that was provided by Nannies and Housekeepers. Staff found that the facility was set up to provide adequate care to the children.
- November 23, Our Lady of Las Vegas Preschool, 3050 Alta: Staff responded to a complaint that alleged teachers were smoking in classrooms. Staff found no smoking taking place in classrooms. The principal of the school was informed that smoking is prohibited in all areas of the campus.

- During October, no environmental investigations of homes where children with elevated blood lead levels were conducted.
- During November staff conducted four risk assessments at Clark County School District pre-school and kindergartens built before 1978. Results of the risk assessments are pending.

Outbreak Investigation Support:

- November 5, Mandalay Bay Noodle Shop Production Kitchen, 3950 S Las Vegas Blvd: Staff accompanied Strip office staff to a complaint alleging three people from a party of four developed diarrhea and vomiting within 6.5-9.5 hours, and one developed diarrhea within seven hours of consuming a common meal of Grandfather's chicken, fried rice, seafood wonton soup, chicken chow mein, calamari, vegetable spring rolls and water at 6:30pm on October 31. None sought medical care. During the investigation, no factors were identified which could contribute to foodborne illness. A concurrent inspection resulted in a 1-demerit "A" grade.
- November 14, Kentucky Fried Chicken, 2355 Windmill: Staff accompanied Henderson office staff to a complaint alleging a party of four people developed diarrhea and vomiting within 6.0-15.5 hours, two of the four also developed fever within 14.5-15.5 hours of consuming a meal of Fried chicken at 6:30pm on November 14. One sought medical care. During the investigation, no factors were identified which could contribute to foodborne illness. A concurrent inspection resulted in a 10-demerit "A" grade.

Body Art:

- During November, staff issued two Cease and Desist notices to individuals operating without a valid health permit and advertising in internet classified ads and two Cease and Desist notices to individuals who were allegedly providing tattoo services from their residences.

Safe Drinking Water:

- November 4, Camp Lady of the Snows Public Water System, Lee Canyon: Staff conducted a sanitary survey of the system and identified a number of common deficiencies, including a well without a proper air vent, the well lacking smooth nosed sample tap, and storage tanks without overflow discharge pipes.
- November 29, Lovell Canyon Public Water System, Spring Mountains: Staff conducted a sanitary survey of the system and identified a number of deficiencies including a missing smooth nosed sample tap, an air vent drainage line sitting in standing water without an air gap, it was also missing a screen at the terminal end. Additionally, the storage tank drainage line was missing an angled flapper valve and an air gap.
- Staff completed the quarterly report for the third quarter of 2010 and submitted the report to the Nevada Department of Environmental Protection, Safe Drinking Water Program. A total of 13 violation letters were sent out to public water systems during the third quarter.

H. Vector Control and Surveillance

West Nile Virus (WNV):

- Trapping and testing of mosquitoes for arboviral diseases ceased for 2010.

Mosquito Control:

- Staff continued to survey and chemically treat mosquito breeding areas as necessary.
- Staff submitted draft Vector Control Cooperative Agreements to the jurisdictions for review and comment. The Cooperative Agreements state that SNHD will incur the costs for chemically treating and monitoring mosquito populations at 'common area' breeding sites and jurisdictional code enforcements will respond to stagnant swimming pool complaints.

Rural Rodent Disease Surveillance:

- Staff completed rural rodent disease surveillance at Angel Peak, Camp Lee Canyon, Harris Springs, and Kyle and Fletcher Camp grounds in the Mount Charleston area. Surveillance at Red Rock and Valley of Fire were cancelled due to inclement weather. Additionally urban rodent surveillance concluded with trapping in Sun City Anthem. In total 80 rodents were tested for Plague and Hantavirus; results are pending.

- A. **Solid Waste Management Authority (SWMA) Hearing Officer Process:** The monthly SWMA Hearing Officer Meeting was conducted November 9 with 24 cases adjudicated, \$50,500 in penalties imposed and corrective actions ordered. There were 33 Notices of Violation mailed in November for the Hearing Officer Meeting.
- B. **Complaints of Illegal Dumping:** The Solid Waste and Compliance Section received 128 complaints of illegal dumping in the month.
- C. **Waste Management Audits and Target Sector Inspections:** The section completed 3,192 Waste Management Audits for the year. Target Sector inspections are tracked quarterly. The Target Sector Inspection program is an interlocal agreement with the Nevada Division of Environmental Protection (NDEP) and is set at 300 inspections per contract year by the agreement.

- D. **CMART Events:** On November 4, staff attended the monthly CMART meeting. No CMART actions were scheduled during the month.
- E. **NDEP UST Meeting:** Staff met with Kevin Sullivan and Todd Croft of NDEP to review the UST program. Kevin Sullivan is the new UST/LUST Supervisor at NDEP and the purpose of the meeting was to familiarize him with the activities of the UST program at the Health District and to introduce him to all of the staff involved with the UST program. During the meeting a number of issues related to UST systems were discussed and a course of corrective action was laid out.
- F. **Recycling Theft Meeting:** Staff met with representatives of the California Department of Justice and Metro to review ongoing investigations and to discuss potential new cases related to the theft of recyclables and illegal recycling operations. There have been an increasing number of illegal recycling centers that have been identified and are now being investigated further. Staffs have provided a great deal of information to both Metro and the California Department of Justice that has greatly assisted in the investigation of these operations.
- G. **US EPA Region 9 All Agency UST/LUST Meeting:** Environmental Health Supervisor Eddie Ridenour attended the US EPA Region 9 All Agency UST/LUST meeting in San Francisco, California November 9 through November 10. The meeting was conducted primarily by the New England Interstate Water Pollution Control Commission (NEIWPCC). The region was represented by California, Nevada, Arizona, Hawaii, Guam, American Samoa and Commonwealth of Northern Mariana Islands. Information was provided for regional performance and how Region 9 UST/LUST compares to other regions. Also discussed were certification programs to better document the number of UST inspections completed, certification programs for UST inspections, enforcement actions taken by states such as fuel delivery prohibitions and red tag authority, multi-state efforts to share information creating an enforcement clearing house, and inspector training in Las Vegas in 2011.

1. Composting Plants

- **Republic Services Medical Waste Facility:** Staff is reviewing the application for a permit. A workshop was held September 22 in the SNHD Clemens Room. Application for a permit was not approved at the October 28 Board of Health Meeting. The facility will continue to operate under Cheyenne Transfer Station's permit. Staff and applicant to present updated Standard Operating Procedures at future Board of Health meeting.

- Plan Review Staff continued working with district management of multiple Terrible Herbst locations to inspect and approve new, customer-self service, hot dog equipment.
- Plan Review staff adjusted work schedules as needed to allow SNHD inspections to be coordinated with City of Las Vegas building department inspections so that the old Mervyn's department store (4700 Meadows Lane) could be gutted and re-built as a Cardenas supermarket for scheduled opening before Thanksgiving weekend.
- Plan Review staff worked with the owner of the Fiesta Discount Mall (formerly Fashion Discount Mall, 2201 Civic Center) to obtain a Swap Meet permit that will allow his vendors to sell pre-packaged, non-potentially-hazardous foods without individual Health Permits. The new Swap Meet permit will allow SNHD to inspect the Mall's restroom, janitorial resources, and pest control procedures – all of which impact operations of their food vendors.
- At the request of the Clark County School District, staff surveyed a remodel of a playground which was constructed at Rose Warren Elementary School located at 6451 W Brandywine Way. The playground equipment was purchased with donated funds from the Junior League and "Kaboom" (a non-profit organization that builds community playgrounds), and construction was performed by Buell Recreation and various charitable groups. The climbing equipment installed is designed to provide an upper body workout and is the first to be installed at a Clark County School. Southern Nevada Health District staff performed the inspection of the equipment and surfacing and noted that a health permit remodel had not been submitted. In addition, several deficiencies were noted with the installation of the equipment. Several pinch points and entrapment issues were discovered as well as lack

evidence of testing certification for the surface materials which were installed. Representatives of Rose Warren Elementary school made application for the remodels and provided the required testing certification. After corrections were completed SNHD staff re-inspected the play-set and approval for the installation was granted.

- Staff completed a "Change of Owner" inspection on the Hampton Inn located at 4975 S Dean Martin Drive. The inspection involved multiple food permits and a public accommodations inspection of the 300-plus room facility.
- Mothers Tofu Mania at 6850 W Spring Mountain (Korea Town Plaza Food Court) failed a final inspection due to the lack of adequate hot water. The failed inspection resulted in additional fees being assessed. The water heater was repaired and the facility was able to produce the required hot water at greater than 120° F. A health permit was issued after the re-inspection was completed.
- On November 18, 2010 an inspection for a new seasonal permit, Lupita's Mexican Food, was conducted at 183 S Moapa Valley, Overton NV. The food trailer was custom built will NSF approved or equivalent components for the service of potentially hazardous foods (high risk). Under the new 2010 Southern Nevada Health District Food Regulations, a fire suppression system with a properly ventilated hood is required over the cook-line. The staff member observed the installers tag on the system which read "No Fuel and No Electric Shut Down". When the staff member asked about the comments written on the tag, the owner stated they were unaware of any problems. When the installer was contacted, it was explained to the staff member that the owner was told that a gas /electric shut off was required and would have to be installed by an electrician. The owner informed the installer that they would get an electrician to install the unit. The staff member contacted his supervisor, and food trailer was not approved. The owner was required to make the necessary correction and schedule for a final inspection.
- On November 8, 2010 a final inspection for a remodel was conducted at Terrible Herbst located at 1101 Sunset. The scope of the remodel was for a self service hot dog roller. The hot dog roller area was inspected and passed. The back room was inspected and the hot water temp taken at the 3 compartment sink. The temperature would not go above 110° F even after the owner adjusted the hot water heater. Upon examination of the hot water heater, the Plan Review inspector noticed it was rusted out at the bottom and leaking. The establishment was told they would be required to replace the hot water heater within 24 hours or face possible closure. The next morning the hot water heater was replaced and operating. Temperatures exceeded 120°F at the 3 compartment sink as required.
- The Tropicana Hotel ownership has implemented Plan Review staff recommendations for upgrading the kitchens and food storage areas with impressive results, including replacement of most of the walk-in refrigerators and freezers, and new blast chillers for the bulk cooking kitchens.
- Split permits were finalized for Wagon Master at Buffalo Bills in Primm, NV. Wagon Master (MSC Corporation, which is associated with Denny's) took over the café but needed to split out sections that they would be using from the Casino. They had several structural issues that needed repairs with floors and walls and they will be coming into Plan Review for remodel.

- Inspections have been continuing with Cosmopolitan Resort and Casino. The majority of in-house inspections have been completed. The focus this month has been on the leased restaurants. A problem was found at Blue Ribbon Sushi Bar & Grill when upon inspection it was found that all the custom stainless equipment was not third party certified to NSF/ANSI standards. The manufacturer was SKL Prime Fabrication, which according to NSF is an approved manufacturer, but they did not appropriately mark the equipment so staff was unable to approve. Cosmopolitan had to contact a local approved manufacturer and NSF. They conducted a field inspection. They approved and marked some equipment and only allowed the marking of equipment once Royal Metal had made some corrections. Once completed staff was able to verify on site and approve the permits
- Many of the venues at the Cosmopolitan are preparing food using special processes and are required to provide HACCP plans, Waivers, and SOP plans. So far this has not been completed by their in house Sanitarian.

Developed a FAQ sheet for policy updates and continued to review information submitted by the FERL group.
- C. Training Officer Susan LaBay developed a system to intake and track HACCP Plan, Operational Plans and Waiver submittals. Met with the Plan Review staff to discuss PPE and to determine the need to purchase additional PPE equipment. Performed 2010 Food Regulation training for McDonalds on November 29th and Suncoast (2 classes), November 4th. Met with individuals from the Las Vegas Visitor and Convention Authority to discuss the required hand washing for tasting events at Cashman Field and the Las Vegas Convention Center, November 15th. Performed a preliminary review of a HAACP Plan submitted by Binion's and met with the executive chef to discuss correction need to make the plan approvable, November 30th.
