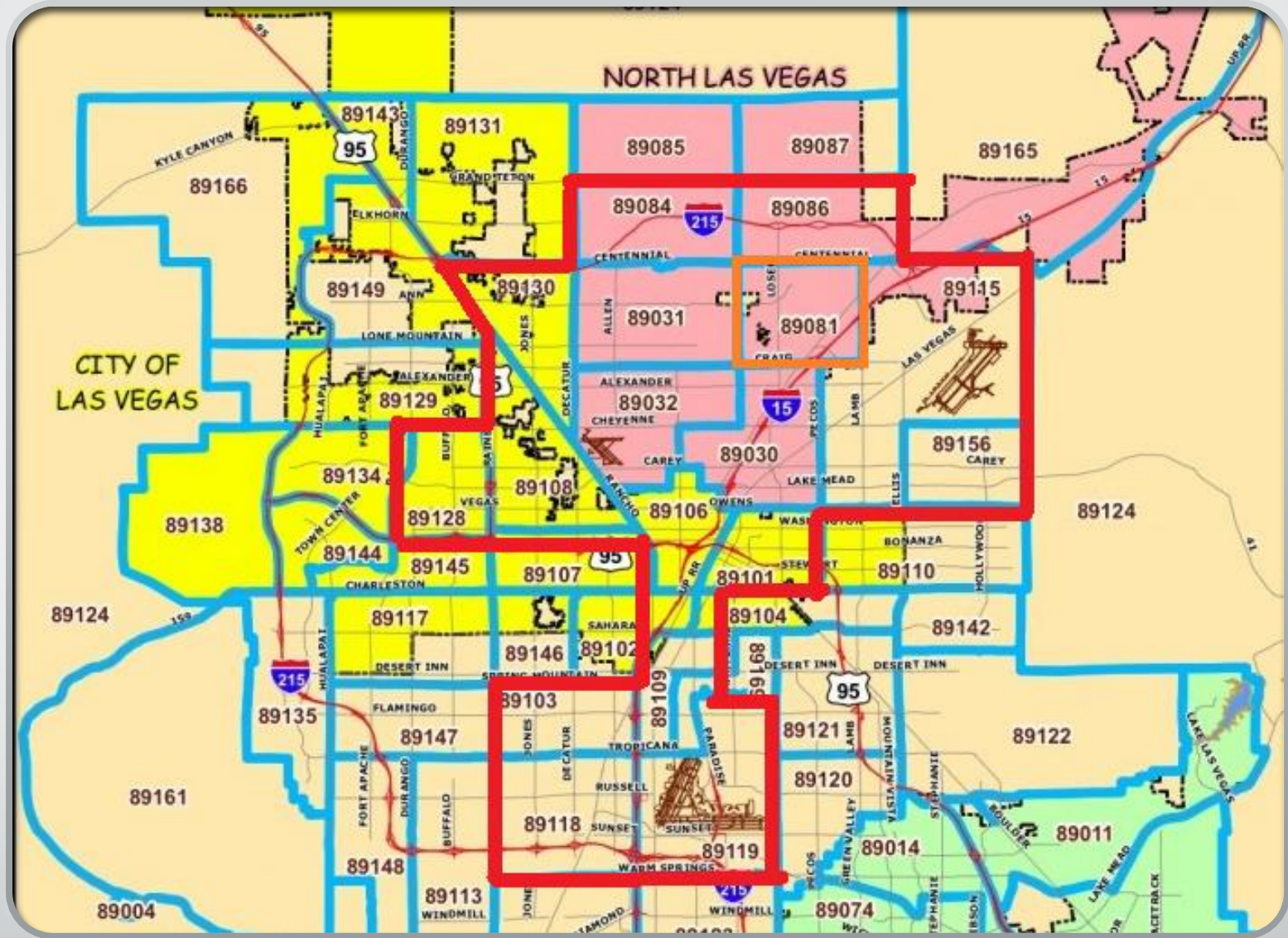
# Proposed Outcome Measures

Increase the percentage of:

- Infants/children up-to-date on immunizations to 90%
- Infants/children who have a medical home to 80%
- Women who have a medical home to 78%
- Infants who have a developmental screening to 90%
- Women screened for Intimate Partner Violence to 85%
- Women screened for depression to 85%

## Targeted Zip Codes

- \*89169 and 89109 consistently showed the highest percentage of inadequate prenatal care and the lowest percentage of adequate prenatal care from 2016-2018 (State of Nevada Department of Health and Human Services)

# Staffing

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Two full-time Community Health Workers (CHWs) serving as parent educators and patient navigators funded by general revenue funds.

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One Generalized Maternal Child Health Nurse at 0.5 FTE in-kind from the Maternal Child Health program providing initial/periodic screenings to identify risks/needs of participants.

This individual along with the in-kind program Community Health Nursing Supervisor will be available to the CHWs to address any concerns about participants.

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The team will serve 85 pregnant and parenting families of children 0-12 months of age over the year.

# Timeline Highlights

**7 Oct. 2019**

Interviews occurred the week of October 7, 2019 and offers of employment were extended.

**11 Nov. 2019**

Training on the new electronic health record occurred the week of November 11, 2019.

One CHW began employment the October 2019. The second CHW began employment the November 2019.

**Oct.–Nov.**

Formal training on the curriculum, as required by the developer, is pending for April 2020.

## Program Progress to Date

The CHWs have:

- Completed the required agency and division trainings.
- Reviewed the program curriculum in preparation for the formal training.
- Completed training on the evidence-based tools used for screening of participants.
- Ongoing training with the program supervisor on maternal child health topics and their program role
- Shadowed nurses in both the Maternal Child Health and Nurse-Family Partnership programs.

## Program Progress to Date

- CHWs completed joint home visits with the Maternal Child Health nurse assigned to the program & started joint management of cases.
- The CHWs and program leadership are marketing the program with community partners.
- The CHWs started enrollment with currently serving 11 families (17 participants).
