

6 things to know about **OVERDOSE RESPONSE**

1



CALL 911

Report an **UNCONSCIOUS PERSON**.

2

SPRAY



NALOXONE

EVERY 2 MINUTES

Until **MEDICAL HELP ARRIVES** or the person **BREATHES** on their own. The person may not look like they are awake due to non-opioid substances that may also be present.

3



PERFORM CPR

If able, using reasonable care, **ADMINISTER CPR** between doses of naloxone.

4

WAIT
FOR AN



AMBULANCE

It is essential to receive **MEDICAL ATTENTION** after being revived with naloxone as it could wear off before the life-threatening substance does.

5



RECOVERY POSITION

Keep the person in **RECOVERY POSITION** (roll them on their side) anytime you are not actively helping them with naloxone or administering CPR.

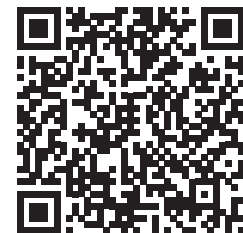
GOOD SAMARITAN LAW (NRS 453C)
