

Three reasons to get the COVID-19 vaccine



It's safe.

The FDA only releases COVID-19 vaccines and authorizes their use to the public when there is enough data proving they are safe and meet or exceed efficacy thresholds.



It's effective.

The vaccines have been shown to be effective at preventing severe illness, hospitalizations and death from variants of the virus that causes COVID-19 currently circulating, including the Delta variant.



It's free.

COVID-19 vaccine administered by the Southern Nevada Health District are provided at no-cost to you. If you have insurance, they may be billed an administration fee. You will not be charged a co-pay and will not receive a bill from the Health District for the COVID-19 vaccine.

Before COVID-19 vaccines are offered to the public, thousands of people volunteered to take part in clinical trials to test the safety and efficacy of the vaccines. These volunteers included thousands of people from communities of color, including Black and Hispanic individuals who participated in the clinical trials.

After receiving the vaccine, you still need to take other preventive measures. These include wearing a mask in public indoor places when disease transmission is high, social distancing, frequent handwashing, and other hygiene practices.
