<sup>1</sup> The updated vaccine are called "updated" because they protect against both the original virus that causes COVID-19 and the Omicron variant BA.4 and BA.5. Two COVID-19 vaccine manufacturers, Pfizer-BioNTech and Moderna, have developed updated COVID-19 vaccines.

<sup>2</sup> Previous versions of the Pfizer-BioNTech and Moderna COVID-19 vaccines are called "original" because they were designed to protect against the original virus that causes COVID-19. The original versions of both of these vaccines are no longer available.

Those who are moderately to severely immunocompromised may get 1 additional dose of the updated vaccine. Talk to your health care provider for more information.
