Resume-Kenneth Osgood, MD, MPH

Kenneth Osgood, MD, MPH, a Board-Certified Pediatrician, is President of Medical Scientific Resources of Nevada, Inc. His current practice is limited to preventive health and biometric testing services.

Dr. Osgood received his undergraduate degree from the University of California, Riverside; his medical degree from the University of Cincinnati, and his master degree in Health and Hospital Administration from the UCLA School of Public Health. He completed his internship, residency and National Institute of Health Infectious Disease fellowship at the Los Angeles County/University of Southern California Medical Center and his applied epidemiology and biostatistics training at the National Center for Disease Control in Atlanta, Georgia. From 1978 until his relocation to Nevada in 1994, he was a Clinical Associate Professor of Pediatrics at the University of New Mexico, School of Medicine.

While in private practice in New Mexico he served as Chief of Staff and member of the local hospital Board of Trustees. In the late 1980s, he began a physician executive career and served as the regional Medical and/or Plan Director for EQUICOR, CIGNA, FHP and United HealthCare. Also, he was the first Medical Director/Clinical Coordinator for the New Mexico Medical Review Association implementing the CMS Health Care Quality Improvement Initiative, and served as the western region Medical Director of SDMS, a national disease management firm.

He served in the Indian Health Service at Tuba City, Arizona. During that time, he published a report documenting the severe infant malnutrition he and his colleagues were observing. Subsequently, Congress reviewed his report and created the national Food Stamp (SNAP) and Women, Infants and Children Supplemental Nutrition (WIC) programs incorporating his recommendations.

During his National Institute of Health Infectious Disease Fellowship, he created a nurse supervised systematic inpatient infection control program which was adopted by the Joint Commission on Accreditation of Hospitals as an accreditation standard.

During his years in private practice in rural northern New Mexico, he and his colleagues implemented health delivery system changes, including the creation of the region's first RN training program and successfully lobbing for state legislative initiatives that created the nation's first comprehensive state wide neonatal transport and delivery system. This system resulted in the reduction of neonatal deaths by 60% within 3 years. He and his partner also implemented a systematic comprehensive pediatric preventive disease practice program resulting in a decrease of the region's annual pediatric inpatient admissions, inpatient days and emergency room visits.

Dr. Osgood served as president of the New Mexico Chapter of the American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP) and also served on the AAP Council and AAP National Child Health Finance Committee. During his tenure as the New Mexico Chapter President the Chapter received the AAP Wyatt Award as the best small Chapter in the United States. During his tenure on the AAP National Child Health Finance Committee, he chaired a subcommittee that designed a supplemental children's insurance program, a program presented to Congress and ultimately adopted. The program is currently referred to as the State Children's Health Insurance Plan (SCHIP).

He also participated in the HealthCare Summit; a national forum that issued a report entitled "Guiding Principles to Protect and Improve the Health Status of All Americans". The report and eight federal reform proposals, released in 2009, was presented to Congress. Most of the proposals were endorsed by Congress and incorporated into the Affordable Care Acts, signed into law in 2010. A follow-up report was released in 2017.

Dr. Osgood has provided expert testimony to Congress on issues of child health systems and finance; to the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) on Medicaid regulations; to the New Mexico Senate Finance and Corporations Committees and the Nevada Legislature's Health Committee on health care issues; and to the Nevada Assembly Committee on Health and Human Services on food insecurity. He also served a term on the Southern Nevada Health District Board of Health. He currently serves on the Nevada Council on Food Security and the Southern Nevada Health District Advisory Board.
