Project Description

The goal of this internship is to assist the HDAD committee with planning, organizing, and executing Health District After Dark (HDAD) events. The outcomes of this internship will include at least two deliverables: a pre-and post-HDAD event evaluation and a longitudinal assessment of the last 5 years of HDAD events. The intern will assist the SNHD HDAD team with planning, marketing, logistics, set-up, and tear-down of HDAD events. This may include assisting with grant deliverables for the CDC public health infrastructure grant, assisting on a manuscript or professional organization presentation, designing and implementing a survey, and data analysis.
