MXXAITIEID ACACC

AEDES "ANKLE BITER" AEGYPTI

BLACK MOSQUITO WITH WHITE MARKINGS:

AGGRESSIVE ANKLE BITER THAT BITES THROUGHOUT THE DAY

Prefers to bite humans over other animals

Does not fly long distances (200 yards)

LAST SEEN:

LAYING EGGS IN SMALL CONTAINERS OF WATER

including tires, bird baths, and planters







Breeding source most likely close to where they're biting

Once eggs hatch, larvae can become adults in 7-10 days

GUILTY OF:

TRANSMITTING VIRUSES SUCH AS DENGUE, CHIKUNGUNYA AND ZIKA TO HUMANS

To date, these viruses have not been found in local mosquitoes

ELIMINATE BREEDING SOURCES AROUND YOUR HOME

Tip and Toss: Once a week, tip over or toss out items in your yard that gather water, such as tires, buckets, planters, toys, pools, birdbaths, flowerpot saucers, open bags of recycling, or trash containers.

Report Green Swimming Pools: Report green pools to your local Code Enforcement agency.

PROTECT YOURSELF

Use EPA-registered insect repellents with an effective active ingredient, such as: DEET, Picaridin, IR3535, Oil of Lemon Eucalyptus

Wear long-sleeved shirts and long pants

Install screens on doors and windows so mosquitoes don't get into your home

Treat clothing and gear with permethrin
