## Two Cases of Travel-Associated Legionella Reported

## SITUATIONAL AWARENESS SUMMARY

**Situation**: The Southern Nevada Health District (SNHD) has confirmed cases <u>of Legionnaires' disease</u> among guests who stayed at Caesars Palace Hotel and Casino.

- One individual stayed during December 2023, and the other individual stayed during June 2024.
- Water sampling conducted on the second case detected Legionella sp
- The facility continues to conduct remediation of the water system.
- The most recent testing performed on 7/24/2024 has come back negative.
- Legionnaires' Disease (LD) has a case fatality rate of 5-10%.

## **Recommendations for Providers:**

- ✓ **Consider.** Providers should consider *Legionella* infection when evaluating patients for community-acquired pneumonia who:
  - Experience: cough, fever, shortness of breath, myalgias, or headaches.
  - Failed outpatient antibiotics for community-acquired pneumonia.
  - Report overnight travel with water exposure (hot tubs, showering, decorative fountains).
  - Report a stay at Caesars Palace Hotel and Casino from July 11, 2024 July 24, 2024.
- ✓ <u>Test.</u> While testing for more common causes of respiratory illness, consider testing for Legionella when <u>appropriate</u>. Recommended tests include:
  - Legionella urine antigen testing
  - Culture of lower respiratory secretions when possible
  - Lower respiratory sputum PCR or DFA

- ✓ <u>Treat.</u> Treatment for Legionella is a macrolide (azithromycin) or a fluoroquinolone (levofloxacin).

  There is no need to change therapy if a patient is already on empiric treatment with another macrolide or quinolone and is symptomatically improving.
- ✓ **Report.** Legionella is a nationally notifiable disease. Ensure timely reporting to SNHD's Disease Surveillance and Control via Fax 702-759-1414 or Phone (702) 759-1300.
