Monkeypox Virus (MPXV) Clade I in the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC) with Spread to Neighboring Countries

SITUATIONAL AWARENESS SUMMARY

Situation: The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) distributed a <u>Health Advisory on</u> <u>8/7/2024</u> updating the situation on monkeypox (mpox) cases due to MPXV clade I in the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC). Reports of human-to-human transmission have been noted in the neighboring countries of Burundi, Rwanda, and Uganda. The mpox situation in DRC was <u>initially reported</u> by the CDC in December 2023.

- There have been no cases of MPXV clade I in Southern Nevada.
- Due to the limited number of travelers and lack of direct commercial flights from DRC or its neighboring countries to the United States, the risk of MPXV clade I importation is low.
- The CDC is helping communities monitor the presence of both clades of MPXV in wastewater.

Recommendations for Providers:

✓ <u>Consider:</u>

- Mpox when evaluating the cause of a rash.
- Mpox lesions may be small, firm, rubbery, deep-seated, well-circumscribed with a centrifugal distribution.
- Symptoms such as fever, chills, lymphadenopathy can occur.

✓ <u>Test:</u>

 Collect a sample and order appropriate diagnostic tests.

✓ <u>Treat:</u>

- Access to treatment with tecovirimat (TPOXX) or brincidofovir can be coordinated with SNHD if unavailable at your institution.
- Prevent: Recommend mpox vaccination to:
 - Persons with known or suspected exposure to someone with mpox.
 - Gay, bisexual, or other man who has sex with men or a transgender, nonbinary, or genderdiverse person who in the past 6 months has had:
 - i. A new diagnosis of a sexually transmitted infection (chlamydia, gonorrhea, or syphilis).
 - ii. More than one sex partner.
 - Any person who in the past 6 months has had:
 - i. Sex at a commercial sex venue (bathhouse or sex club).
 - ii. Sex related to a large event or in a geographic area with current mpox cases reported.
- ✓ <u>Report:</u> MPXV is a nationally notifiable disease. Ensure timely reporting to SNHD's Disease Surveillance and Control via Fax 702-759-1414 or Phone (702) 759-1300.
